Our specialist team of therapists, doctors and legal experts hold an international reputation for providing therapeutic care, medical consultation, legal protection, and practical support. The Helen Bamber Foundation is committed to safeguarding vulnerable adults and children.

We are looking for a Clinical Psychologist to join our therapy team.

OVERVIEW OF THE ROLE

As a Clinical Psychologist within the Hummingbird service, you will report directly to the Senior Clinical Psychologist and the Director of Therapy at the Helen Bamber Foundation responsible for the service and support them in providing a comprehensive range of therapeutic interventions to clients of the Hummingbird Project. This role will include delivery of highly specialised psychological assessments for both medico-legal and clinical purposes, provision of

appropriate evidence-based therapies, delivery of clinical supervision to staff, and where relevant, supervision of assistant and trainee clinical psychologists on final year specialist placements. At times, the role may include input into policy, research and fundraising and delivery of consultancy and training.

We are looking for someone who is committed to working therapeutically with young asylum seeking or refugee people who experience trauma spectrum disorders and other psychological difficulties as a result of surviving human rights abuses, separation from family, and/or post-migration stressors. In addition to proven experience in working therapeutically with this client group, the candidate will have a passion for human rights work beyond the individual client work, and a desire to contribute to effecting change at a policy level. This role requires the ability to react and respond creatively and appropriately to the needs of both charities. You will be expected to travel to London for up to three weeks during the first year to attend inductions and other trainings (your travel costs will be met).

MAIN DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Under the supervision of senior clinicians at the Helen Bamber Foundation, work independently to ensure the delivery of a range of evidence based psychological therapies to clients of the Hummingbird Project.

- Provide specialist psychological assessments and deliver psychological therapies to clients of the Hummingbird Project.
- Train in the preparation of medico-legal reports and where relevant, contribute to the preparation of these reports for clients at the Hummingbird Project.
- Develop and carry out audits and research projects relevant to the Hummingbird project (in collaboration with the HBF and Hummingbird leadership teams).
- Provide internal and external training in collaboration with your line manager.
- Supervise junior staff. This may include trainee clinical psychologists, assistant psychologists, and research assistants.
- Provide a weekly support group for non-clinical staff where needed.
- Liaise with other non-statutory and statutory organisations on matters of clinical care and policy.
- Monitor the effectiveness of the interventions provided and provide feedback to funding bodies in the form of data and reports.
- Promote the work of the Hummingbird Project/the Helen Bamber Foundation at conferences and other events.

PERSON SPECIFICATION

The successful candidate will be a clinical psychologist who is passionate about working with survivors of human rights abuses, delivering evidence-based therapies for posttraumatic stress disorder and other mental health problems, as well as understanding the unique social and political context our clients are living in and the effect of this on their psychological wellbeing. They will be highly motivated and able to work independently.

Please note that the individual working in this post will be exposed to material of a highly traumatic nature and will hear and read about extreme human cruelty. You will be subjected to a public online search

Essential

- Have successfully completed a recognized doctoral level training in Clinical Psychology (DClinPsy) and to have completed a range of clinical placements during training.
- To be registered with the Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC)
- Have experience in working with clients with PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder) and other trauma spectrum disorders.
- Have experience in working with individuals who have experienced multiple traumatic events, developmental trauma and/or have a clinical presentation suggestive of 'complex' PTSD.
- Have experience of delivering therapy for the treatment of PTSD using trauma focused CBT (Cognitive Behavioural Therapy), EMDR (Eye Movement Desensitisation and Reprocessing), or Narrative Exposure Therapy.
- Have experience in assessing and providing evidence-based therapies to individuals from a range of cultural backgrounds, and through interpreters.
- Have experience of presenting at conferences or other events.
- Have experience of, and commitment to, multidisciplinary team working.

- Have a working knowledge of the legal, political, and social issues in the human rights, asylum & refugee, and health sectors.
- Exceptional organizational skills with experience of managing multiple tasks and prioritizing effectively.
- Accuracy and excellent attention to detail.
- Good interpersonal and team working skills, with an ability to work independently and seize opportunities.
- Computer literate and confident in using all MS Office software.
- Understanding of, and commitment to, the objectives of the Helen Bamber Foundation and the Hummingbird Project
- Understand and Implement trauma-informed practice and systems

Desirable

- To have successfully completed a specialist trauma placement during clinical training.
- Experience of providing clinical supervision.
- One year's post qualification experience.
- Experience of working in the non-statutory sector.
- Demonstrable experience in research skills and preparation of manuscripts for publication.
